



How to Install and Configure ArchiveOne® Enterprise (Compliance)

Note

This topic explains how to install and configure ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance).

Before You Begin

Before you perform the procedure in this topic, be aware of the following:

- The account used must have sufficient permissions to be able to create user accounts and mailboxes (typically a domain admin account).
- The Exchange journal function needs to be enabled for the mailbox stores.

Procedure

Prepare for the ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance) Install

1. Download the ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance) installation package.
2. Logon to the server as a user with the correct permissions (see above).

Install ArchiveOne ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance)

1. Run the newly downloaded ArchiveOne Enterprise installer.
2. On the first page, click the Next button to initiate the installation.
3. Accept the License Agreement and Click **Next**.
4. Optionally, edit the User Name and Organization listed in the Customer Information screen and click **Next**.
5. Select the required options to install (usually both for a first installation).
6. Optionally change the install to location and click **Next**.
7. If you're happy with these choices, click **Install**.
8. Enter the Exchange server name (typically one with the CAS role) and click **Next**.
9. Choose a location that the software configuration files will be homed on (typically the archive server).
10. Select a group for the service account and click **Next**.
11. Select a name for the service account, enter a suitable password and click **Next**.
12. Check the box to enable members of the group to use DCOM and click **Next**.
13. Wait for group and account replication to finish then click **Next**.
14. Choose to "Start Service" and click **Next**.
15. When the install is complete click **Finish**.

Configure ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance)

1. Open the ArchiveOne Enterprise (Compliance) Console.
2. Select the Status node, right-click and choose 'Run System Configuration Wizard'.
3. Select the name of the server where the configuration files are homed (typically the archive server) and then click **OK**.
4. If necessary, read the sizing guide then click **Next**.
5. If no repositories currently exist then enter a name for your first repository and click **Next**.
6. Select a storage manager (if appropriate) and click **Next**.
7. Enter a path for the index files and click **Next**.
8. Enter a path for the archive files and click **Next**.
9. If necessary, select and set an appropriate rate control value then click **Next**.
10. Select an appropriate retention period for your repository and click **Finish**.
11. Enter your license key and click **Next**.
12. Click Add and choose the mailbox(es) that journal data is delivered to then click **Next**.
13. Choose an appropriate cleanup behavior (the default option is recommended) and click **Next**.
14. Select a public folder to be used for the retrieval process and click **Next**.
15. Click **Next** again.
16. Choose an appropriate frequency for archiving and click **Next**.
17. Set a minimum for the amount of data that has to be in the journal mailbox(es) before archiving will begin and click **Next**.
18. Choose an appropriate location for temporary data storage and click **Next**.
19. Click **Finish**.
20. If the configuration wizard starts again choose Cancel.
